## Begins Hybrid Learning

We are extremely excited to welcome all of our Middle School students back to the building starting Monday, March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2021! These are some basics to know for Hybrid Learning:

- Students have been mailed their schedules. If you have not received yours, please call 541.747.4541
- All MS students will continue to receive instruction via Zoom. Morning online schedules have not changed.
- Teachers will rotate on-site classrooms while students stay put.
- Students will see all of their teachers for all of their classes during their two on-site days.
- Some students will be able to experience band, vocal, and art classes.
- Grab-and-Go-Lunches will be available at the Aux Gym entrance. Students may eat before arriving, sit outside to eat, or take lunch home after school. Chairs are placed 6 ft. apart in our courtyard area, outside of the library, for eating lunch on-site.
- If picking up your student before 3:30, please check them out at the front office.

- Mon & Tues 12:30p-3:30p – All 8<sup>th</sup> grade and ½ of 6<sup>th</sup> grade class
- Wed & Thurs 12:30p-3:30p – All 7<sup>th</sup> grade and remaining 6<sup>th</sup> graders

We anticipate High School Hybrid beginning March 15<sup>th</sup>. The afternoon LIPI will continue for High School students until Hybrid begins. When High School Hybrid does begin, students will have access to their Language Arts, Social Studies, Math, Science, and Elective teachers. High School students will be receiving their Hybrid schedules the week of March 8<sup>th</sup>. During Hybrid, students no longer need to schedule an appointment, they may come to school on their assigned days as needed.

There will be a hybrid transition overview Zoom meeting for families to attend Thursday, March 4<sup>th</sup> at 6pm. The administrative team will be available to share what “hybrid” means and how to navigate the process. There will be an opportunity to ask questions and learn more about the coming weeks.
