A LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

It is time to prepare for the 2023-2024 school year. The process begins with families reenrolling their students, allowing us to determine the level of staffing we are going to need in the fall. Those families in grades K-4 who completed the online registration process will receive a postcard in the mail mid-August stating who your student's classroom teacher will be and an invitation to our Fall Meet and Greet the Teacher/Open House event September 5.

Starting fall of 2023, we will implement Kinder staggered start. Staggered start provides an opportunity for teachers to introduce the rituals and routines of the classroom plus time to get to know your student so they can create balanced environments to better meet the needs of each child. Kinder families will be assigned to start either Wednesday, September 6 or Thursday, September 7, to attend school. Students will not attend on Friday, September 8. On Friday, once the classes have been finalized, you will receive a call from the teacher your student will be working with for the 2023-2024 school year. All students will report to their assigned classroom on Monday, September 11. The assigned staggered dates will be mailed home about two weeks prior to the start of school, so families have time to plan for childcare. If a student registers after post cards are mailed, we will call you with their date.

Online Registration is open to any Pleasant Hill School District family who has a child who will be 5 on or before September 1, 2023. You may enroll online at https://pleasanthill.registar.lblesd.k12.or.us/en-us/home.aspx.. Simply click the new student box. Once you have completed the online registration, you will still need to visit our office as we need a copy of your child's immunization record and birth certificate. In addition, we have a Kindergarten Questionnaire for families to complete, which our teachers use to assist with making class lists.

Before you know it, we will be saying welcome back and hello to both our returning and new families. Be watching for that postcard in the mail mid-August letting you know who your child's teacher will be (for 1st - 5th grade student) or which day they will start (K). There will also be an invitation to our **K-5 Meet and Greet the Teacher/Open House** back-to-school opportunity Tuesday, September 5, 2:30 - 3:30 p.m. Until then, have a wonderful and safe summer!

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AGRICULTURE AND NATURAL RESOURCES CTE UPDATES AND NEWS

ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS

The Annual AG CTE plant sale was May 6th from 10-4pm at the PHHS High School Greenhouse. Students from all CTE courses worked together to plan, grow, construct planters, and market this collaborative project. We exceeded our goal of \$5,000!

FFA students invite our community to the Lane County Fair Youth Auction on Saturday, July 22 at 2:00 p.m. 40 students will be showing and selling market and breeding animal projects to the public. Our members show cattle, swine, horses, sheep, goats, poultry, rabbits, and static exhibits all week long. Hope to see you there!

DISTRICT PROJECTS

This spring high school ag students shared with our elementary classrooms an Ag in the Classroom literacy project. High school students will deliver mini lessons to our elementary students on basic animal science production and bi-products. Our high school

students connected with over 300 elementary students and shared agricultural experiences and opportunities.

CONTINUING PROJECTS

CTE faculty and students presented learning outcomes of the new Plasma CNC table at a Lane ESD event showcasing student projects and new metal fabrication curriculum. Mr. Bowden's advanced metals class completed a custom designed picnic table while Mr. Smith's class donated a custom cedar garden planter/bench for the PHHS Booster Club auction. These projects raised over \$1,300 for our Student Athletics and Activities programs.

Our advanced forest science and firefighting course will be completing the Fire School Field day on May 12 at Lane Community College to receive FF2 certifications. Students earning this certification will be eligible to train and work as a wildland firefighter at age 18 or after high school graduation. This will be the first year that students have worked in the arboretum and trained for this certification.

AWARDS & HONORS

This spring the FFA Chapter attended the Oregon State FFA Convention in March and placed 1st in Agriscience projects and advanced on to the National FFA Convention in November 2023. We also placed 5th in Farm Business Management, 4th in Public Speaking, and four students received the State FFA Degree award. In April a Future Natural Resources Leaders (FNRL)Team from Pleasant Hill High School competed at the State Competition at OSU. Tressa Geyer earned first place in Public Speaking and our team placed in several other Natural Resource and Forestry events.

PHHS FFA along with Middle school FFA students will attended a wide variety of Career Development Events this year.
