RE: Investigative Guidance Update

The Oregon Health Authority (OHA) and Lane Public Health Authority (LPHA) released new contact tracing and notification recommendations for K-12 settings. These recommendations will lessen the overall burden of contact tracing on K-12 partners, while ensuring that high-risk exposures continue to be identified.

OHA will no longer consider masked contact in K-12 settings, including school buses, to be an exposure regardless of distancing. The updated guidance will strongly advise students and staff to maintain physical distancing to the greatest extent possible.

LPHA will no longer require PHSD to consider masked contact in K-12 settings (including on school buses) to be an exposure regardless of distancing. Physical distancing should still be practiced to the greatest extent possible.

This means, when an individual has tested positive for Covid-19 and is onsite during regular student contact time (the school day), those individuals who properly wear their masks are no longer considered to be in close contact and may continue to be onsite for their education. Thus, under this new guidance, PHSD will only investigate a case if the infected student was around peers who weren't masked.

There is a caveat. When individuals are at lunch, with their masks off while eating, they need to be at a minimum 6 feet apart, less than 15 minutes in close proximity, in order to not be considered a close contact should there be a positive Covid-19 case in the vicinity.

We have another new protocol change. Communication to all families when we have identified a positive Covid-19 case onsite will no longer be our process. PHSD will contact only those families who have a positive case of Covid-19 identified or those families who we have determined to be in close contact to a positive Covid-19 case.
