A Letter from the Superintendent

Dear PHSD Community:

I'm excited that we are now in the first weeks of a new school year for the Pleasant Hill School District (PHSD) and our Pleasant Hill community as we continue to put the worst of the COVID-19 pandemic behind us and address our future. Every team member of the PHSD has worked hard over the past year and we were able to have school in person all year, which was a major achievement and something to celebrate. Our team, with board support, has strived to ensure we have the right programs, staff, and resources to build the foundation to move the district to the next level of success.

We all know it is critical that PHSD implements health and safety protocols to mitigate the spread of COVID-19. And over the past few months, state education and health officials have worked to draft another <u>resiliency framework</u> for public school districts that shifts to a more traditional, local decision-making model. PHSD has fulfilled the requirement of having the safety protocols, following statewide quarantine and isolation protocols, mandating use of face coverings, and providing a process to support students. The following documents were submitted to ODE/OHA/LPHA before we opened for the school year: <u>Safe to Return to School</u>, <u>Communicable Disease Management Plan</u>, <u>COVID-19 Exclusion Chart</u>, and <u>When Should I Keep My Child Home?</u> All can be found on the PHSD website as well.

After more than a year of implementing physical distancing, cohorts, isolation protocols, and other measures, we continue the necessary practices to mitigate COVID-19 and create a welcoming and inclusive learning environment for students and staff. Providing strong COVID-19 protocols is one imperative; however, it is also essential to help students and staff build and rebuild relationships and make sense of the challenging and sometimes traumatic last 18 months to set the foundation for the school year ahead.

We also know that in-person instruction, delivered safely, provides our children and families with the greatest access to an equitable education. Schools not only educate our kids, but also act as a center of services to students and families, offering nutritious meals, access to social-emotional and mental health supports, as well as physical health services. As we continue to work our way through this pandemic we need to continue to work together in partnership as a school district, families and our community at large.

It is PHSD's plan to continue to provide a traditional school schedule this year with all students learning in-person. As an educator, I am excited about everything that will be possible this year for our students as we open up all of our amenities, programs and school activities. It is a pleasure to work and serve in the PHSD and everyone is looking forward to what we will accomplish this year.

I want to thank everyone for your continued support of the school district and, as always, if you have any questions or concerns please feel to reach out and let us know.

A Letter from the School Board

Dear PHSD Families and Community,

As the new school year starts, Pleasant Hill School District welcomes two new School Board members: Drew Gottfried and Rusty Rexius. They were elected to replace Jeff Bernardo and Curt Offenbacher, who both chose to retire from the Board. Many thanks to Jeff and Curt for their years of service and dedication to the students of Pleasant Hill.

I was hoping that this school year would start as a normal year. Unfortunately, it was not to be. The staff and administration are again challenged to provide a meaningful educational experience to our students during these uncertain times. I would like to thank everyone, from staff to students and parents, for making the best of the situation last year and the start of this year.

Earlier, Governor Brown indicated that school boards would be able to exercise local control in deciding issues, such as whether masks would be mandated in school or not. The district sent out a survey based on the perception that the Board would be able to exercise local control.

Soon after the survey became live, the Governor shifted away from local control and mandated masks. We don't know where the Board would have stood on masks; it has never been discussed, as we have not had an option. I do know that it is a very difficult issue when considering both mental and physical health concerns. If at any time in the future the Board has the opportunity to set the policy, we would certainly value your input.

Why is Parent Involvement Important?

Become more involved:

- joining our PTO
- volunteering, being a guest presenter, reader whenever possible
- · attending parent-teacher conferences, family nights, and other events
- communicating with your child's teacher on a regular basis concerns and successes
- keeping your child's teacher informed about events in your child's life which may affect his or her performance at school

Become an active participant:

- serve as a role model, showing your child that you support his or her education by partnering with their teacher
- assure that you are aware of your child's progress, demonstrating to your child how important their progress is to you
- teach your child that your input at the school is appreciated and that you support the school's efforts

The staff of Pleasant Hill Elementary will:

- provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment
- · check in with families building relationships
- hold parent conferences in October, either in person or zoom to share student strengths and weaknesses
- · jointly formulate goals for your student to work towards during the school year
- provide families with progress reports/report cards at the end of each 9 weeks.
- reach out to families as needed
- be available to parents to answer questions, address concerns, share ideas via
 Seesaw, email, voicemail or in person by appointment or zoom

The staff of Pleasant Hill Elementary is asking you to:

- ensure your student is at school, on time, unless excused due to an illness
- take a few minutes each day to ask your child about their day at school
- partners with us, working to assist your child in being successful
- call and talk with your child's classroom teacher before calling the office about any concerns as well as successes
- make reading 20 minutes, over and above any Lexia Core 5 or Epic assignments, nightly a priority within your family
