### NEW: FIRSTVIEW BUS TRACKING

PHSD is launching FirstView®, a bus tracking and parent communications app for your smartphone or desktop.

This app will help parents track their student's bus before and after school. Parents can set up to be notified when the bus is near their stop.

A password-protected account is required for each user. This will ensure only you can view your student's stop. Codes are provided by your school.

For any assistance with the app, parents may contact FirstView® Monday through Friday by phone, email, or the in-app assistance button.

## SPECTATOR LIMITS LIFTED

Pleasant Hill has lifted its capacity limits for all home games. All spectators are welcome.

Spectators will not need to obtain tickets prior to the game.

The Oregon Health Authority still requires that all spectators wear masks when not actively eating or drinking at indoor events.

Any person(s) who fail to cooperate with the masking policy will be reminded of the policy and may be subject to penalties that could include removal from the game and forfeiture of tickets to future events.

## OHA MASK REQUIREMENT UPDATE

The Oregon Health Authority (OHA) will remove mask requirements for indoor public places no later than March 31, 2022. Mask requirements for schools will be lifted on March 31.

These decisions on the path forward will take time. Over the next several weeks PHSD will be working with Lane Public Health Authority to help us make an informed decision as to how to proceed.

Please continue to reinforce health and safety protocols, we hope to keep as many students in school as possible.
